

MINUTES OF THE GPBC BOARD MEETING MAY 14, 2014

Minutes of the April board meeting—Steve noted minor changes needed, and notified Randy about those.

We have six events in the next month, and he would appreciate help, especially with the MADDads/Toastmaster Bike Rodeo, which he agreed to organize for them.
